LOCAL OPTION
The office of the Ontario Branch of the Dominion Alliance is a busy place at the present time. The fall and winter Field Day Campaign has begun. The Alliance is supplying speakers for an average of one hundred Sunday services; which the movement for the suppression of the liquor traffic is forcibly advocated.
The staff, of more than thirty clerks, is kept busy attending to correspondence and other details, in addition to the men who constitute the office and Field Secretary staff.
No effort or expense is being spared in the great battle being waged for the extinction of the bar rooms, Local Option voting to take place in the beginning of 1914.
Up to the present time campaigns looking toward voting on January 5th have been launched in forty-eight municipalities. Of these places one is a city, thirteen are towns, fourteen are incorporated villages and the remainder are townships. There are eleven of the forty-eight which have not yet voted upon the question of Local Option; there are ten in which majorities were polled against Local Option in former contests; there are twenty-six in which Local Option by-law was defeated by the three-fifths requirement; and there is one in which a Local Option by-law was carried and subsequently quashed upon a technicality. The list of places is as follows:
PLACES NOT BEFORE VOTING
Towns—Brockville, Prescott and Wiarton.
Villages—Jarvis, Marmora and Springfield.
Townships—Dunn, Marmora and Lake, Ross, Russell and Tivy.
PLACES GIVING MAJORITIES AGAINST LOCAL OPTION
Towns—Tilsonburg.
Villages—Delhi, Merrickville, Morrisburg and Woodbridge.
Townships—Ainwick, Bayham, Bexley, Mara and York.
DEFEATED BY THREE-FIFTHS
City—Sault Ste Marie.
Towns—Arnprior, Aylmer, Barrie, Cobourg, Meaford, Napanee, Oakville, Picton and Thessalon.
Villages—Bradford, Burlington, Grand Valley, Kemptville, Port Perry, Port Rowan and Sutton W.
Townships—Albermarle, Flamboro W., Flos, Georgina, Gloucester, Kitley, Puslinch, Scarborough and Tav.
THE QUASHED BY-LAW
The municipality in which a Local Option by-law was carried and subsequently quashed is Bastard and Burgess.
All these contests have been brought on by the temperance party. Others may be promoted, as the submission of a by-law in a municipality may be compelled by a petition of twenty-five per cent. of the electors filed with the municipal clerk on or before November 1st.
The liquor men may also, by similar action, bring on a repeal contest in any municipality in which a Local Option by-law is in force if three years have elapsed since the last vote on the question. It is therefore probable that the total number of contests will be much in excess of the forty-eight set out in the foregoing list. There is going to be a lively fight.

DULL CHEESE MARKET
The cheese market took a drop of a quarter of a cent last week, the highest offer at Thursday's meeting being 12 1/2 cents. It was flatly refused, no sales being recorded, but on the street nothing more could be learned as having been paid and must be accepted as the day's ruling. Auctioneer Henderson vigorously wielded the hammer and President McDonald announced at one stage that they had been looking for 13c, but would meet the buyers half way and would accept 12 1/2c. Even this sunny proposition did not move the buyers.
The registration showed a big falling off, the total being 2,756, of which 1,721 were colored and 1,025 white.
Before the sales were taken up, John Webster, M. P., entered a complaint against the poor boxes turned out from this station. He was in Montreal this week and brought home a sample of a cover that had arrived in the Metropolis from this section during the week. It was only one of many, he stated. The rim was torn away and about one-quarter of the cover was missing. It was altogether too thin and the material of the poorest.—Recorder.
