ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may domesticate a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. ... In certain conditions a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section of available Dominion land in each of three years.
