Sealed Tenders addressed to the undersigned and endorsed "Tender for dredging Maritime Provinces" will be received until Monday, May 15, 1911, at 4 p.m. for dredging required at the following places:

Prince Edward Island, Summerside and Verner River, Nova Scotia, Antigonish, Digby, L'Archeveque, Anty's River, Margate Harbour, St. Mary's River, West Bay, New Brunswick, Buctouche Beach, Cape Bonaventure, Loggieville, Marquisit Lake, Ox Island, Raft Channel, Richibucto, Scotchtown, Shidiac, Shipigan Gully, St. George, St. Stephen.

Tenders will not be considered unless made on the forms supplied and signed with the actual signatures of tenderers.

Combined specifications and form of tender can be obtained on application to the Secretary, Department of Public Works, Ottawa. Tenders must include the towing of the plant and from the work. Only dredges can be employed which are registered in Canada at the time of the filing of tenders. Contractors must be ready to begin work within thirty days after the date they have been notified of the acceptance of their tender.

A separate cheque for each place for which a tender is submitted must accompany the tender. This cheque must be equal to five per cent (5 per cent) of the amount of tender, based on the approximate quantities set opposite the name of the place, but in no case must the cheque be for a less sum than \$1,500. The cheque must be accepted on a chartered bank, and payable to the order of the Honourable the Minister of Public Works. The cheque will be forfeited if the person tendering declines to enter into a contract when called upon to do so or fail to complete contract, but will be returned in case of non-acceptance of tender.

The Department does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any tender.
