Princess Marie, in marrying the crown prince of Rumania surrenders all hopes of succeeding her royal grandmother, Queen Victoria.

Stratburg Cathedral is undergoing restoration. All the defaced carvings of the exterior are being minutely remodelled by the aid of pictures and casts.

Cardinal Logue is eleven on the list of the lately-created members of the Sacred College.

Mr. George Land Fox, Vice-Chancellor of the Primrose League, England, is a convert.

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A statue of Father Damien, the hero of Molokai, is being executed by the Belgian sculptor Meunier for the University of Louvain.

The annual Calendar of the University of Louvain, which has just been issued gives statistics which show that the great Catholic University of Belgium is in a flourishing condition.

The largest hotel in the world is to be erected at Chicago. It is to occupy the square at St. Nicholas and Chestnut.

Mr. Gladstone's Home Rule Bill seems to have strengthened the liberal party materially in England.

The first bye election held after the provisions of the measure were made public resulted in the Liberal candidate winning by a majority of 446 in a total of 900 votes.

Jeremiah Jordan, McCarthyite candidate in South Meath, has been elected by a vote of 2,707 to 2,688 for J. J. Dalton, Parnellite.
