Sir John Macdonald and Sir Francis Hincks attempted to make it appear that both Mr Huntington and the Times had been misinformed. In the course of the discussion, Mr Alexander Mackenzie stated that in 1865, when it was known that Congress was averse to prolonging the treaty of 1854, Sir John had proposed a very similar measure; in fact, had gone so far as to propose reciprocal tariff legislation, our tariff to be regulated by that of the United States. To this, Sir John replied that it was the Secretary of the United States Treasury, Mr McCulloch, who had suggested that arrangement. Mr Mackenzie answered as follows:—"The hon gentleman will not escape from me in that way. There was a minute-of-council which I saw when I was invited to join the Government, which proposed a system of reciprocal legislation." This settled the dispute about the nature of the negotiations in 1865, and helped, to some extent, to corroborate Mr Huntington's version of the character of the negotiations in 1869. The latter affair was, some years afterwards, cleared up by Mr George Brown. Shortly after his return from Washington, after trying to negotiate a reciprocal treaty, Mr Brown made a speech on the subject in the Senate, in which he said:—"In 1869 formal negotiations were entered into with the American Government, and the project of a treaty was presented for discussion. The negotiations continued from July, 1869, to March, 1870. The project included for a term of years the cessation of our fisheries to the United States, the enlargement of our canals, the free enjoyment of the navigation of the St. Lawrence, and an assimilation of our customs and excise duties, and some other propositions." No one attempted to dispute Mr Brown's statement. The question is, if discrimination against England was not disloyal in itself twenty years ago, why should it be so now? Since 1869 the market of the United States has become incomparably valuable as a mart for Canadian trade. The thirty odd millions then have become over sixty millions now, and the individual and national wealth of the country has grown at least in equal proportion. Moreover, whilst
