**NELO-FRENCH DEBT NEGOTIATIONS.**

LONDON, Aug. 26. The British Chancellor of the Exchequer, Winston Churchill, and the French Finance Minister, Caillaux, today reached an agreement, in principle, on the funding of the French War Debt to England, whereby France makes 62 payments of 125,000 francs annually, subject to various matters of detail, including the rate of interest, to be determined by the French Government.

**THE HOPE OF AVERTING ANTHRACITE STRIKE.**  
WASHINGTON, Aug. 26. Government observers of the Anthracite coal situation here have no hope of averting suspension of work on Sept. 1, and have turned attention to a plan to look to the nation of a strike before the Government.

**FRENCH NOTE ON SECURITY PACT.**  
PARIS, Aug. 27. The French note to Berlin on the Security question suggests that Germany open negotiations for a Security Pact, based on membership in the League of Nations and the execution of the Treaty of Versailles.

**TERMS OF THE PACT.**  
LONDON, Aug. 26. France and Allies have invited Germany to enter into negotiations for a definite treaty intended to guarantee peace in Western Europe. The three main points were that the Versailles Treaty must not be modified, that Germany should enter the League without reservations and a provision for compulsory arbitration of future disputes. An early conference is in prospect.

**LITTLE HEADWAY IN THE SEAMEN'S STRIKE.**  
LONDON, Aug. 26. White despatches from several Italian ports say that the strike of British seamen continues to spread and the crew of one steamer, at Durban, South Africa, has walked out, the movement is making little headway in Great Britain.
