THE CHOLERA. Cairo, May 23.-There were 32 deaths from cholera here yesterday. No fresh cases reported. In Alexandria there was but one death caused by cholera and no new cases.

BURIAL OF ARCHDUKE LUDWIG. Vienna, May 23.-The funeral of Archduke Carl Ludwig, brother of Emperor Francis Joseph, who died May 19, took place yesterday. The services were simple and without pomp. The remains were deposited in the imperial vault in the Capucine Church. The Emperor and the other members of the imperial family, with the exception of Archduke Francis, whom the doctors forbade to attend, were present, as were also a number of foreign princes, diplomats and ministers. A large crowd attended the

FIGHTING IN CRETE. Athens, May 23 .- A detachment of Turkish troops at Yoxaris has been besieged by the Christian populace for two weeks, and in the fighting that has occurred eighteen men have been killed. In a fight at Draza ten men were killed. The success of the insurgents has caused a panic among the Turkish rustic population, and large numbers are flocking into the towns for protection, fearing that they would be massacred if they remained hundred in their homes. Fifteen Turkish men, women and children in the country about Retimo have taken refuge in that town.

TO STUDY THE SEAL. London, May 23 .- The Under Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, Mr. George N. Curzon, in the House of Commons said that with co-operation of Canada and the United States, two professors of natural history will shortly proceed to the Bering Sea in order to study the fur-sealing industry. Mr. Curzon said that the regulations for sealing in British Columbia were in some respects contrary to the recommenda-tions of the British Commissioners.
