

Wales are to visit Vienna this month in state, arriving there on April 19 for a four days' stay at the Hofburg. Neither of them has as yet made the acquaintance of the old Emperor, and King Edward is anxious that his only son and heir should pay his respects to the dean of the European monarchs before the latter comes to England in May. Most of the other crown princes made a tour of the various European courts for the purpose of becoming personally acquainted not merely with foreign rulers but likewise with the members of the latter's families and with the leading men of their empire or kingdom. The Kaiser's son, for instance, has been to England to Russia, to Austria Italy, and even Turkey. Archduke Francis Ferdinand, the heir-presumptive to the throne of Austria, has paid state visits to the courts of St. James, St. Petersburg, and Berlin. But the Prince of Wales. has called on none of his father's brother monarchs, except upon the Kaiser

It may be assumed that the Princess of Wales, as future Queen of England, will be received with all the honors due to her rank in England, since otherwise she certainly would not be accompanying her husband to Vienna, But when one recalls the humiliations to which King Edward's father as prince consort of England was subjected in Austria and Germany by great nobles and petty sovereigns, who declined to see in him anything more than a non-royal Prince of Coburg humiliations which angered Queen Victoria so intensely that she held cloof from all state functions when she visited Germany — one has some ground for apprehending affronts to the Princess of Wales, who, according to German and Austrian ideas, is of norganatic birth, her father, the late Duke of Teck, having been in the eves of continental courts a nobleman, although her mother, it is true was, an English royal princess. That is to say, according to the rules and regulations which govern etiquette at the courts of continental Europe. the Princess of Wales occupies much the same position as the Princess of Battenberg, or any of the morganatic relatives of royalty. For her father was an Australian cavalry officer named Count Francis Hohenstein for many years before being created Prince and Duke of Teck on the occaion of his marriage to Princess Mary of England. 


