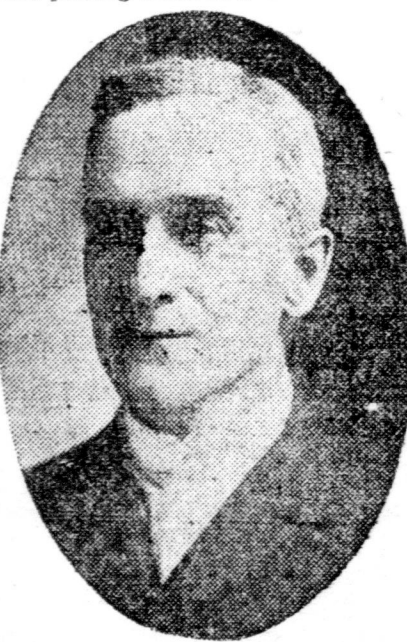

He was most indignant at the uncourteous manner in which he had been addressed, and said that he could not carry back with him over the lines a very favorable impression of the respect and courtesy shown either to citizens or strangers by those in charge of this park. PRACTICAL FURRIER.

With over-congestion, drink, opulent wealth and extreme poverty and the present stagnation in trade with resultant unemployment, the present cabinet have a task before them that will demand their best statesmanship, and so long as Great Britain contains men of the calibre of the present occupants of the treasury benches the much-talked-of decadence will remain a myth, for although the body politic might be suffering from inertia, yet the heart is sound.

The present cabinet comprises all the elements to do the greatest good to the greatest number, and from the Premier down to the lion whelp of the ministry, Mr. Churchill, are imbued with the true spirit of democracy in helping the weak and discouraged, and that the grey of brinded dawn is breaking is emphasized by the optimistic utterances of some of its members.

Besieged by the shrieking sisterhood and beset by German war scares, harassed by embarrassing questions on naval expenditure, the present cabinet still occupy the Olympian heights, every ready to discourse to the greatest number, and from the Premier down to the lion whelp of the ministry, Mr. Churchill, are imbued with the true spirit of democracy in helping the weak and discouraged, and that the grey of brinded dawn is breaking is emphasized by the optimistic utterances of some of its members.

In climbing ambition's ladder they have not lost their heads in the clouds, nor scorn their less fortunate fellows, but labor on in their efforts to fulfill the mission they are charged with in breaking down the barriers of ignorance and want. Pursuing the even tenor of their way, advocating Liberalism, not lunacy, the present ship of state, though buffeted by harsh winds, rides triumphant, and with the first glimmerings of day announce the coming sun.

T. A. Rowat & Co.**IRISHMEN IN KILTS AT NOTABLE MEETING****The Thirteenth Oireachtas of the Gaelic League Described—Big Industrial Display.**

Dublin, Aug. 23.—The thirteenth oireachtas of the Gaelic League closed after several successful sessions. Large contingents of enthusiasts in the language revival movement from all parts of Ireland were in Dublin to participate in the competitions in connection with the oireachtas.

The presence of enthusiastic Gaels from the provinces, tended to give a decided impetus to the work of the Gaelic League in Dublin. A striking feature of the proceedings was the appearance of a large number of leaguers wearing the Irish kilt.

The oireachtas opened with a children's fete, which proved a distinct success. About 200 children, dressed in clothes of Irish manufacture, speaking their mother tongue, and led by two Irish pipers wearing the ancient Irish kilts and playing Gaelic airs, presented an edifying spectacle to all interested in the resuscitation of Ireland's language and pastimes. These children, whose ages ranged from 4 to 14 years, delighted everybody by their exhibition of the intricate art of Irish dancing.

Great interest was manifested in Irish manufactured goods exhibited. The exhibits formed an encouraging display of the amount of work already accomplished in connection with the fostering of home industries.

Industrial firms in the city and country displayed specimens of their art metal work, antique pattern jewelry, hurling and football balls, bicycles, books, boots and shoes, bracks, church furniture, work, confectionery, embroidery, enamel work, gloves, hosiery, inlaid woodwork, leather work, women's hats, lace, medals, needles, needlework, plaster work, polishes, pastry, pipes, rugs and mats, stained glass, sculpture, soaps, statuary, silver plate, tobacco, umbrellas, woollens, and many other articles of everyday life. All of which are manufactured by Irish hands.

Awards were made to writers of the best articles on the following subjects in the literary competitions:

Essay—How the New University Can Best Serve the Interests of Ireland and the Irish Language.

Essay—How to Give Expression to Modern Ideas by Means of Irish Literature and Drama.

Short Story—Irish novel of at least 50,000 words: a middle or old Irish story of episode turned into modern Irish.

Irish Stories—Dealing with life in Ireland at the present day.

History of Ireland—Dealing with the conditions and life of the people up to the end of the sixteenth century.

Short Irish Verse—Irish.

Original Poem or Song.

Original Irish Melody—Arranged to Irish words, original or selected.

Just Irish Verse—Irish suit two melodies from Petrie's collection.

Irish National Anthem—With English and Irish words.

The conclusion of the announcement of the awards, Dr. Douglas Hyde delivered a brief address in Irish, stating that the oireachtas this year exceeded its predecessors in importance. The Gaelic League continued to forge ahead, he said. It had this year put an Irish opera—and a good Irish opera—on the stage.

He had not one, he said, whether hostile to the Gaelic League or sympathetic, who had not said it was doing excellent work. He announced that a great meeting, at which representatives
