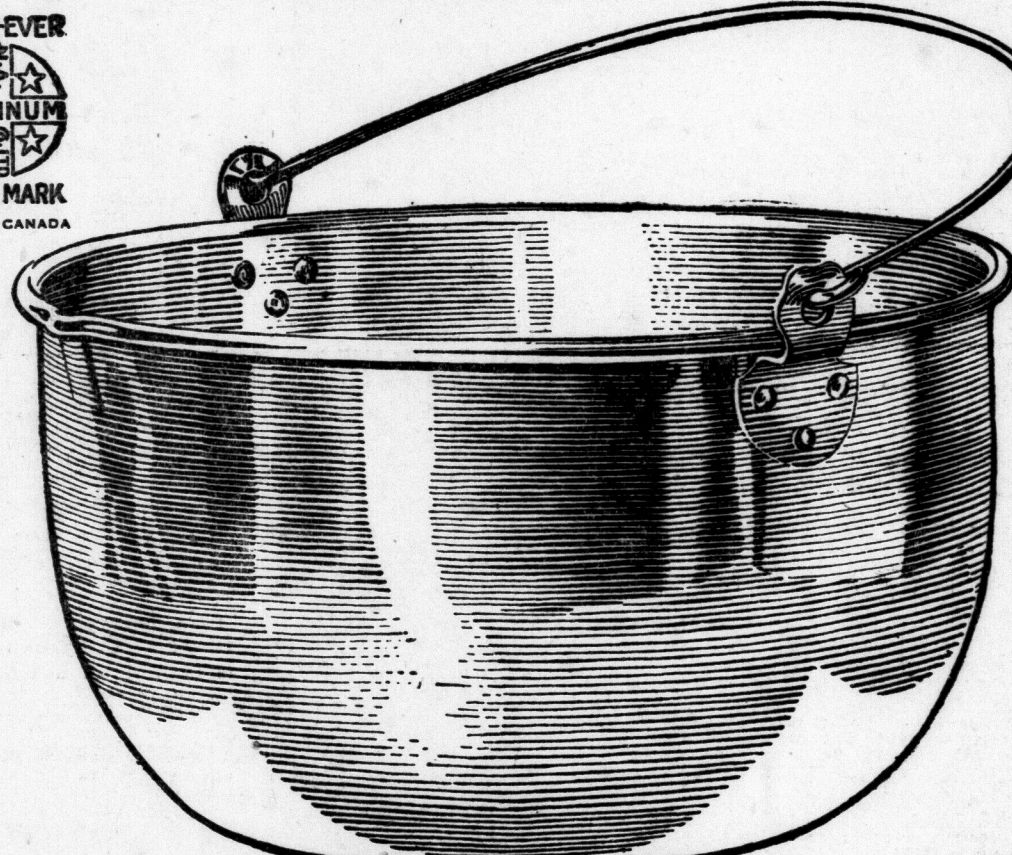

Chatham, Aug. 21.—Miss Irma Paterson of Windsor returned from Muskoka last night. Miss Paterson, who is a former well-known resident of this town was a guest at the Wawa Hotel, having arrived only on Saturday prior to the fire. Miss Paterson lost everything excepting a frock and coat she returned in, and was helpless. She is suffering slightly from shock, and her hair was singed a little from the flames which chased her through the hotel to safety.

Miss Paterson had retired early in the evening and was aroused by the horrible screams, but in her dazed condition went back to her bed and asleep again. A great bang on her door awakened her the second time, and when she opened the door she was almost overcome by the smoke and flames. Miss Paterson attempted to find her trunk key to obtain a large amount of money she had taken with her, but was rushed out of the building just in time to save her life. Many of the people went insane, stated Miss Paterson, and said that the sight of the ruins was unbearable.
