SAVE THE BOYS

Last week it was the duty, and no doubt a painful one for Judge McLatchey, to sentence two boys to a long term, four years in the Reformatory. There is no doubt the sentence was merited, and under the circumstances, was the best thing to do; but is our responsibility as citizens for this state of affairs lessened? Are we doing our duty to provide healthy and proper recreation or surroundings for the boys and youths of our town? We deplore and regret the occurrence but what are the churches, the societies, the schools and even the citizens as a whole doing to prevent a recurrence of such an incident?

The two boys who were sentenced, were bright, intelligent little fellows, clever and industrious, and if their footsteps had been guided aright, would have made good, useful citizens. Whatever, the cause, lack of home training or pernicious companionship, they drifted away from the paths of rectitude, with no one to extend the helping hand in the form of healthy recreation and amusement. And they degenerated to a very low level. Why should this be so? Is there no society to take an interest in boys of this kind who are

never wholly bad, but who are lacking opportunities accorded their more pampered brothers in larger cities, who have healthful recreation and instructions in Y. M. C. A. buildings; and who perhaps don't take the same advantage as the boys would here, who have absolutely no place to go to but hang around the corners with hands itching for mischief.

This is a big question and ought to be carefully thought over, and a move ought to be made by the churches in some direction to tend towards the uplifting of those whose robes are dragging in the mire.

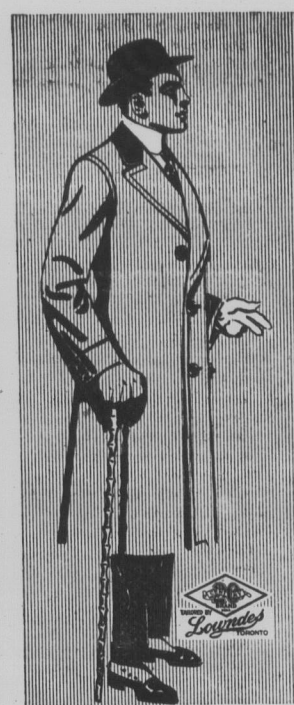
