CONFERRING THE FATHOM.

EDMONTON, Aug. 25.—The ceremony of conferring the fathom on the *St. Andrew*, a ship of the British Navy, was held here this afternoon. The ship was presented to the Canadian Government, and the fathom was conferred on her by the British Consul.

ENGLAND WILL PARTICIPATE.

LONDON, Aug. 25.—The British Government has agreed to participate in the proposed naval expedition to the north-west coast of Africa. The expedition is intended to suppress the slave trade, and the British Government has agreed to provide the necessary vessels and personnel.
