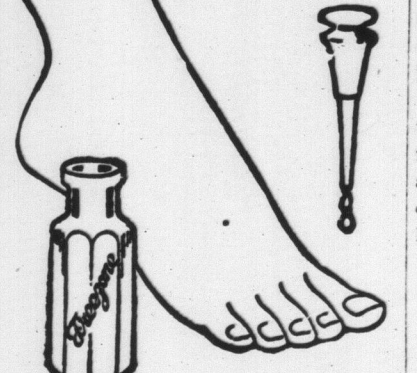


UPPER GRANVILLE

The wet weather has been bad for the grain crops. Mr. Jason Anthony is visiting his many friends in Port Lorne.

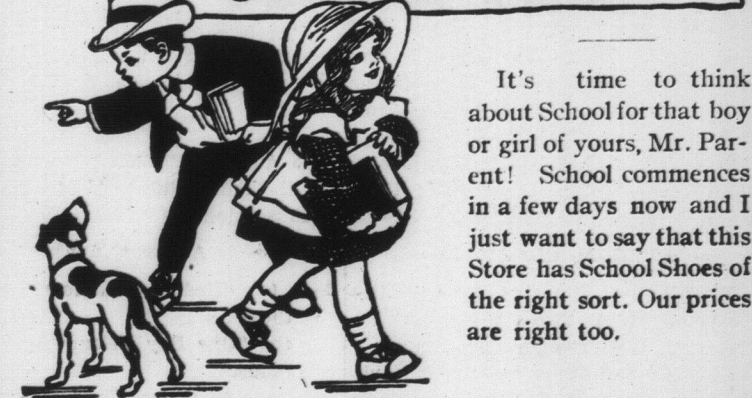

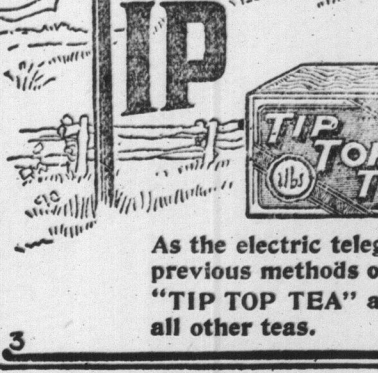
