Wire rope, crucible steeel, six-strands, nineteen wires; $1 / 4-\mathrm{in}$., $\$ 2.75 ; 5^{-16}$, $\$ 3.75 ; 34, \$ 4.75 ; 1 / 2, \$ 5.25 ; \$ 6, \$ 6.25 ; 34, \$ 8 ; 36, \$ 10 ; 1$-in., $\$ 12$ per 100 teet.

8pikes.-Kailway spikes are steady, at $\$ 2.45$ per zoo pounds, base of $1 / 1 / 2 \times 9-10$. Ship spikes are steady at $\$ 2.85$ per 100 pounds, base of $\$ 6 \times 10-$ ${ }^{1+1} \mathrm{ch}$, and $\$ / 8 \times 12$-inch.
