EXCELLENCY,

I have the honor to refer to the Memorandum signed on April 28, 1961, by the Secretary of Commerce of the United States of America and on May 1, 1961, by the Minister of Transport of Canada concerning arrangements for the co-ordination of pilotage services to be provided in United States waters and Canadian waters of the Great Lakes and the St. Lawrence River as far east as St. Regis, pursuant to United States Public Law 86-555 (Great Lakes Pilotage Act of 1960) and an Act of August 1, 1960, to amend the Canada Shipping Act (Chapter 40 of the Statutes of Canada), respectively.
