2. What kind of aircraft were they and what was their purpose on each occasion?

3. How many of such aircraft were, in fact, military aircraft?

4. How many of such aircraft were, in fact, troop carriers?

5. How many of such aircraft were in military camouflage colour and had all registration numbers and state demarcation painted out of view? Is this contrary to Canadian Air Regulations?

6. Does Russia or any other foreign country have secret military bases in Canada? If so, where are they located and give details of their operations?

7. Does the federal government, any minister or department, have any knowledge of Soviet Cosmospheres and if any are located in air space above Canada or the United States? If so, where are they located and what is their purpose?

8. Are there any foreign trained terrorists or activists in Canada? Who, where and why are they permitted to remain within Canadian boundaries? Are they Canadian citizens?

9. Is the federal government, any minister, federal agency or department, aware of the fact of foreign trained terrorists or activists residing in Canada and that still further are being trained in foreign countries to be moved to Canada? Give full details and advise what action is being taken.

10. How many Russian K.G.B.'s are located in Canada? How many members of the Russian army are located at strategic points in Canada near the United States' borders?

11. How many, if any, guerilla camps are located in each of the provinces of Canada? At what locations?

1. With regard to the Public Service classification study of approximately 2,000 positions in the Ottawa/Hull area, in what percentage of the cases (a) did Treasury Board undertake bench (or desk) audits to confirm the validity of the job description (b) were the job descriptions simply accepted as an accurate reflection of the work done and merely compared to the classification standard without a bench audit?

2. (a) How many positions at the (i) senior executive (SX) level (ii) senior personnel authority level, were audited and, in each case, how many were found to be overclassified (b) what percentage of each occupational category and group were found to be overclassified?

3. How many (a) senior assistant deputy ministers (b) assistant deputy ministers (c) directors general (d) directors, were audited and what percentage of each group were found to be overclassified?

4. How many positions in deputy ministers offices were audited and how many were found to be overclassified?

5. Which departments had greater than a 16% rate of overclassification?

6. In the opinion of Treasury Board auditors, which departments perform effective internal classification audits and which do not?

7. What percentage of the overclassified positions were held by female employees?
