

1876 By the Honorable Mr. *Botsford* :—

February 17—That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General, praying that His Excellency will be pleased to cause to be laid before this House, copies of all reports and other documents communicated to the Post Office Department by the Post Office Inspector for the Province of *New Brunswick* as the result of that officer's investigation into the conduct of the Postmaster of *Sackville*, together with copies of any certificates of character, or recommendations in favor of such Postmaster.

By the Honorable Mr. *Girard* :—

“ 17—That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General, praying that His Excellency will cause to be laid before this House, copies of all instructions to the Honorable *Alexander Morris*, Lieutenant-Governor of the *North-West Territories*; also copies of all Orders in Council relative to the said Territories since their organization, and not already published; also copies of all reports and official correspondence between the Lieutenant-Governor and the Dominion Government from the date of his appointment.

By the Honorable Mr. *Kaulbach* :—

“ 17—That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General, praying that His Excellency will cause to be laid before this House, copies of all papers and correspondence between the Government and the “Direct Cable Company” the “Anglo American Company” and all other Atlantic Companies since the 1st October, 1873.

By the Honorable Mr. *Aikins* :—

“ 18—That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General, praying that he will cause to be laid before this House a copy of all correspondence that has taken place between the contractors for Departmental Printing and Binding and the Government on the subject of their contract.

By the Honorable Mr. *Bureau* :—

“ 18.—That a Select Committee be appointed to inquire into the working of “The Insolvent Act of 1875,” and to report what amendments thereof, if any, appear to be advisable, with power to send for persons, papers, and records.
