
Dear Doctor:

As a result of a questionnaire that was circulated on April 20, 1932, the local committee of the Pan-Pacific Surgical Association at a meeting held on September 22nd, unanimously decided that the projected 1933 Congress be postponed for at least one year or longer, dependent upon the improvement in world economic conditions.
