

of the first Principal - the late
D. J. Mountain Bishop of Quebec,
at that time (1821) Archbishop of
Montreal?

He it was who is said to
have initiated the plan to convert
the College into a University, and
this was accomplished largely
through his instrumentality. In
1823 he was appointed a professor
and Principal.

The Authorities at my dis-
posal are not very clear as to
whether there was a Principal
of the College in Authority
during the transition period,
but the implication is that, under
the new foundation, D. J. Mountain,
who had been recommended for
the post, is to be recognized as
