

the said Surveyor shall have a right to demand ten shillings. Every person so building without having had such line drawn, or, after such line being drawn, encroaching thereon, shall incur the penalty of having so much of the said building demolished as shall encroach upon the said line. And any person who shall build at a distance from, and within the line so drawn, shall incur a penalty of ten shillings, unless there be erected in front of such building, even with the said line (if within the city) a stone or brick wall, or pallsades, upon a foundation of stone or brick, or (if in the suburbs) a fence of such materials, or of wood. And every person so offending shall also forfeit and pay three shillings for each and every day that shall elapse after he or she shall have been ordered by the said Surveyor to conform to this regulation, until a wall, pallsades or fence be made, conformably thereto. And any undertaker or mason who shall build without such line being drawn, or who shall not conform thereto when drawn, shall forfeit the sum of forty shillings.

ART. 3.—In all cases within the city and suburbs where it may be necessary to lay down materials for building or repairs, in any square, street or lane, the same shall be so laid down as not to extend therein more than one third of the breadth thereof; or if there be buildings or repairs to be made at the same time, opposite to each other, then the materials shall not extend therein, on each side, more than one sixth of the breadth thereof. And previously to any such materials being laid down, application shall be made to the Surveyor of roads who shall measure off the said third or the said sixth (as the case may be) reckoning from the building, or wall to be built or repaired; and such materials shall not extend lengthways, in front, beyond that of the lot whereon the building
