NEW YORK, May 23.—President Johnson of Norfolk & Western has completed survey of the road's flood damage in Ohio and finds that to make permanent repairs will require 500 men for four months and 200 men for four months longer. He expects to see the work finished by March, 1914. Estimated damage to roadbed, bridges, tell-graph lines and buildings, and values of lost materials is \$526,500, while loss of revenue, due to floods, approximates \$500,000. A further expenditure of about \$700,000 will be required to prevent similar loss under like conditions.
