## BILL C<sup>16</sup>.

## An Act for the relief of Anna Cibula Reynolds.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Anna Cibula Reynolds, residing at the town of Laval-des-Rapides, in the province of Quebec, housekeeper, wife of Howard Joseph Reynolds, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the city of Winnipeg, in the province of Manitoba, has by her petition alleged 5 that they were married on the fifth day of December, A.D. 1942, at the city of Montreal, in the province of Quebec, she then being Anna Cibula, a spinster; and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, because of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and 10 whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:— 15

Marriage dissolved. 1. The said marriage between Anna Cibula and Howard Joseph Reynolds, her husband, is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

Right to marry again. 2. The said Anna Cibula may at any time hereafter 20 marry any man whom she might lawfully marry if the said marriage with the said Howard Joseph Reynolds had not been solemnized.
