THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL B^s.

An Act for the relief of Reginald Clare Darrah.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Reginald Clare Darrah, domiciled in Canada and residing at the township of Sutton, in the province of Quebec, manager, has by his petition alleged that on the eighteenth day of September, A.D. 1945, at the said township, he and Phyllis Mary Bidwell, who was then of the said township, a spinster, were married; and whereas by his petition he has prayed that, because of her adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of his petition be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved.

1. The said marriage between Reginald Clare Darrah and Phyllis Mary Bidwell, his wife, is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

Right to marry again.

2. The said Reginald Clare Darrah may at any time hereafter marry any woman whom he might lawfully marry if the said marriage with the said Phyllis Mary Bidwell had not been solemnized.
