ARTICLE XI.

PENALTIES.

- 1. Members absent from regular annual election shall be fined fifty cents unless a sufficient excuse is given either in person or in writing within thirty days after said election.
- 2. Should any member disregard the authority of the presiding officer by persisting in using improper language or conducting himself in a disorderly manner the presiding officer may fine such member, or the Society may inflict such punishment as the nature of the offence may require.
- 3. Any member who shall knowingly propose an unworthy candidate, or who shall be guilty of habitual drunkenness, or of wilfully deceiving a member of the Society, or who shall divulge (except to a member) any of the proceedings of the Society required of him to be kept private, or the name of any person who opposes the admission of a candidate, or who shall violate his obligation, shall be fined, reprimanded, suspended, or expelled as a two-third's majority of the members present at a special meeting of the Society held for that purpose may determine.
- 4. Any member accepting appointment on a committee and failing to attend to the duties of the same shall be fined fifty cents, unless sufficient excuse is given.
- 5. Any officer absenting himself for three consecutive regular meetings (except in case of sickness
