h. been There has not, in years paft, been the moft cordial fellowflip between the three baptift churches in *Shafe/bary*, but the Lord has now effected a happy mion between us. On the laft Lord's day in January, we all met at one communion table. That happy day my foul had defined for years. Nothing but experience could have made me believe it possible; that I could have felt to much folid delight, anticipated to much trouble; and rejoiced with to much trembling, at one and the fume time. That day I truft will never be forgotten by me;

The north part of *Bernington*, which lies fouth of us, has fhared confiderably in this grace, leveral from thence have joined the churchesin this town, and lome few members from the town north of us; but the greatest part that have been wrought upon are within this town which is fix miles square.

In about two months after the work began, the whole town feemed to be affected. Conference meetings were attended two or three times in a week in almost every neighborhood; and it was furprising to me, that icarechys fingle inflance appeared of any over-heated zeal, or flight of paffion 1 Both finners' under conviction, and those newly brought into the liberty of the goipel, converted in their meetings with the greatest freedom; they fpake one at a time a few words, in the most folem manner I ever heard people in my life. And in general they 'pate to low, that their aftemblies must be perfectly fill, or they could not hear them : Yet a remarkable power attended their convertation. Sinners would tremble as thoogh they felt themielves in the immediate prefence of the great Jehovah.

Some of all ranks and characters among us have been taken; from the most respectable menibers of fociety, to the whet in the place. Some of our most metal Deills have bowed the knee to King Jefus. And a number of Univerfairfs have forfaken their definitions, and embraced the truth.

In the revival four years ago last fummer, we then received ten children into the church, aged from nine to thirteen years, with a number of other young people; all of them remain in good flanding with us, and are now able to help others; excepting one, who, I truft, is gone to the church triumphant. In this revival we have received fixteen whole ages are from nine to fifteen years. From nine, I have baptized fome of almost every age up to feventy !

We have now upwards of one hundred unmarried perfons in this church. There are also a large number of youths
