by incessant demunciations of the Church of Rome, or by stirring up suspicion amongst the brethren? If instead of attending to the great Apostle's advice, to make known the message of good will entrusted to us, "by pureness, by knowledge, by long suffering, by kindness, by love unfeigned," we "bite and devour one another," assuredly we shall be "consumed one of another."
