The observations in the Secretary's minute with regard to the aspirations for a Treaty were approved.

The Hon. W. L. Mackensie King, C.M.G., then moved:-

"That the suggestions put forward prior to and at the meeting and the Sepretary's minute thereon be referred to the Executive Committee for consideration."

This was carried.

The Revd. Albert Carman, D.D., reverted for a mor tent to the nature of the duties confided to the Executive Co. mitee, asking to what extent that body would have the power of deciding as to the course to be followed.

The President explained that, speaking generally, the Executive Committee would have the power of directing the operations of the Association, though occasions might arise when the General Committee would be summoned to consult upon the policy of the Association.

The proceedings than terminated.
