ed after the signing of peace. This was one of the military regulations deemed suitable and appropriate to the period of occupation. The regulations were very much less severe than those which the Germans were accustomed to impose in occupied territories. He believed that our regulations would bear comparison with those of any of the other great powers during the war. He was not prepared to deprive the army of its rights.

Replying to a supplementary question as regards the Amglican practice, Mr. Churchill said he was quite content to be guided by the officers responsible for the conduct of the British army, which was not likely to be unduly severe. (Cheers).
