ASSESSMENTS ARE SENSIBLE C.P.R. WILL REPEAL HEIRS

Another Day's Work by Court of Revision—Some Interesting Decisions.

The C.P.R. secured a reduction on its assessment on the Esplanade frontage yesterday morning from the court of revision. The court of revision also tried to convince the company, also tried to convince the court that the C.P.R. Telegraph Company should not be taxed upon its gross receipts in addition to a business tax.

The Beddell Furniture Company's property at Yonge and Queen-streets, was twice assessed, owing to a mistake. One made it 30 per cent. on the department store basis, and the other, as a retail business, called for 25 per cent. The latter was upheld.

The Leader Pharmacy Company was assessed for 3 feet of land they did not own. The court of revision decided that the assessment was avoided by reducing the business assessment from \$1900 to \$1600, and by the property assessment as it was.

From One to Another. The Toronto Court of Revision's assessment of \$10,000 was claimed to be altogether out of proportion with their neighbors, the Matthews Bros. Company.

The court gave decision in the Queen's Hotel appeal, totally only \$250. It was claimed the property had depreciated on account of new competitors, etc., but the assessment of \$90,000 was confirmed.

Rated as Departmental. Whether or not the C.P.R. Company was the point in question regarding its assessment, the court of revision, in its decision, stated that five lines of goods, the contention that they were running simply a fancy goods store last year's business, was therefore confirmed.

The Murphy Iron Works Company, Yonge-street, per Mr. C. H. Hays, claims that as they were paying taxes in Walkerville, had no income in the new business in Toronto as yet, and their property was totally only \$250.
