The budget was filled with extravagant items and money could be found by revising the budget. This method, the committee proposed, should be coupled, with the provision that the right to make such revision belonged to parliament and not to the ministry. The impossibility of forming a coalition ministry, together with the showr of strength developed by the govern ment in the council of the empire (upper house of parliament), evidently has had the effect of temporarily prolonging the life of the Goremykin ministry, and also has resulted in the postponement
