

TONY FAUST, 30 TO 1, WINS CONEY ISLAND HANDICAP

Notasulga Beats Cohort in Daisy
Stakes—Jockey C. L. Miller
Breaks Leg.

NEW YORK, June 21.—Tony Faust, a despatched outsider, at 30 to 1, won the Coney Island Handicap, 6 furlongs, at Sheepshead Bay to-day, beating some very fast sprinters. King's Daughter was second and Dreamer was third. Halifax, the 13 to 5 favorite, finished outside the money. King's Daughter looked a winner, but in the final furlong Shilling brought Tony Faust up and won by one length. Notasulga, second choice, won the Daisy Stakes. Jockey C. L. Miller had his leg broken when Punch, his mount in the fifth race, ran into the fence with him. Jockey Notter was suspended for three days by the starter. Two favorites won. Summary:

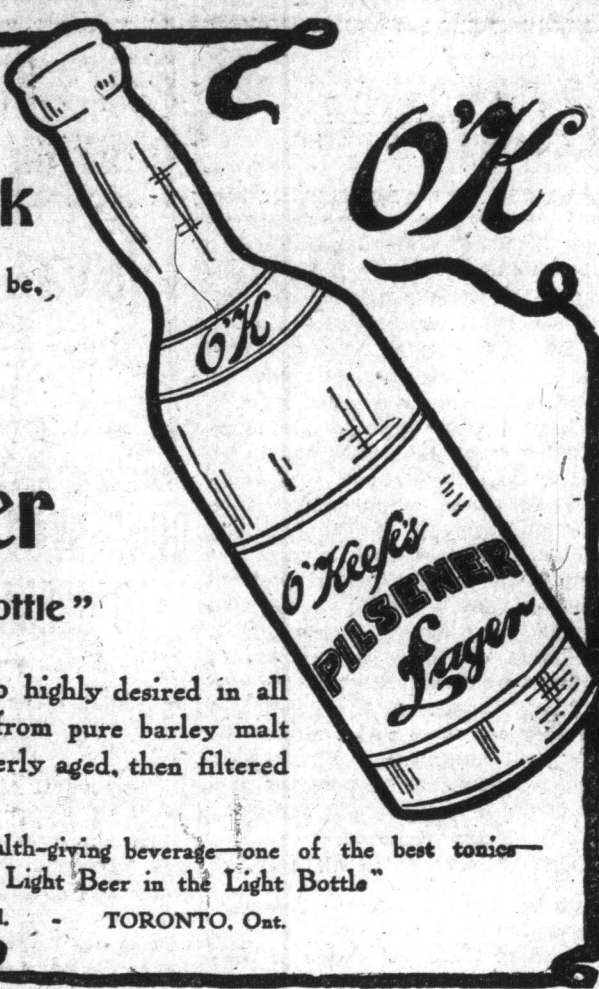
