

Road Purchased by David Fasken Will Pass Into the Commission's Hands Soon

Information with a ring of truth in it leaked out on Saturday that David Fasken of Cobalt has bought the Nipissing Central Railway for a company of capitalists with whom he is identified.

Local officials of the Timiskaming and Northern Ontario Railway Commission are hot on its trail, and will acquire the Nipissing Central Railway through Cobalt to connect with the Kerr Lake branch of the T. & N. O.
