
INTERESTED **CELEBRATION OF** TRAFALGAR DAY

"It is quite evident from the responses that have been received from individuals and institutions, such as the Governor-General of Canada, Lord Willingdon, Lt.-Gov. WOODSTOCK, N. B., Oct. 11 Leonard Todd, 5-year-old son of Chesley Todd, 40, proprietor of the Riverside Hotel, here, is dead of razor gashes, while his father is in the L. P. Fisher Hospital here tonight seriously injured from self-inreside Hotel. Attempts to frustrate the attack were made by E. L. Joudry, a roomer at the hotel and a co-worker of Todd's in a local tailoring establishment, and by a neighbor's little girl, but before successful separation of the man and boy could be made. Todd it man and boy could be made, Todd, it is claimed, had practically severed his son's head and had slashed his own throat. The victims were quickly ished to the hospital where the boy lied shortly after admission.

TODD'S HURT SERIOUS. The injuries of Todd, it was reported although hopes are held out by attending physicians for his recovery.

Todd is known normally as a quiet peaceful citizen. Of late, however, the local police have had many com-plaints concerning Todd's behavior for the trouble.
