

BAPTIST CHURCH ANNUAL MEETINGS

Reports of an excellent year were received at the annual meeting of the Germain street Baptist church held last night in the Baptist Institute with the pastor, Rev. S. S. Poole, in the chair. The clerk, S. E. Fisher, reported a resident membership of 480 and a non-resident membership of 79, making a total of 559. The treasurer, W. C. Cross, reported total receipts from all sources, \$28,189.69, including \$6,109.50 from the Forward Movement.
