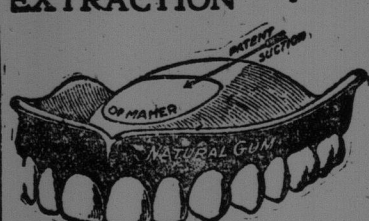

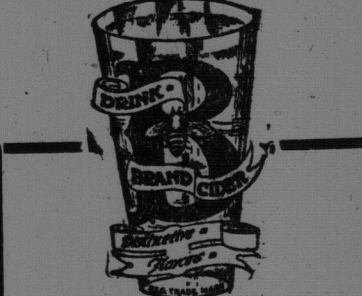

New York, Sept. 10.—Four thousand New York firemen and policemen today asked for salaries of \$2,500 a year, beginning Jan. 1. At present they receive \$1,450 to \$1,900 a year.

Charlottetown, P. E. I., Sept. 10.—Haber Rogers, of Alberton, son of former Governor Rogers, has been appointed chief superintendent of education for this province, vice R. H. Campbell, who resigned to go to Wilkie (Sask.) to teach school.

Charlottetown, P. E. I., Sept. 10.—Henry B. MacLeod, son of Rev. M. J. MacLeod, of Collegiate church, of St. Nicholas (N. Y.), was drowned Wednesday in Orwell Bay. He had been spending the summer with his father's relatives in Orwell.

The body was recovered and buried in Belfast cemetery.

KILLED BY BANDITS
Frank H. Connolly, formerly of Windsor, Carleton Co., son of the late Mr. and Mrs. B. T. Connolly, was killed by bandits in Great Falls, Montana, on Monday morning. He was a member of the Great Falls police force and, seeing two men preparing to rob the Arlington Hotel, he went up to them, but they immediately fired at him lodging six shots in his body. Mr. Connolly died in the hospital three hours later. His wife, formerly Miss Edith Smith of Fredericton, was with him when he died. There are two children, Harold and Margaret.
