



#### School Established For Girl Farmers

Some years later a Frenchman named Thimonier brought out an improved machine for sewing cloth. In 1833 Walter Hunt, an American, introduced the first locksittch machine, but neglected to take out a patent. About 12 years later Elias Howe produced a machine. Howe was ignorant of the fact that Hunt had previously invented an almost identical one, and Howe's was the first patented lockstitch machine.

seeing machines today are pratically the result of constant improvements and modifications of early machines. The chief types now in use induct the rotary shuttle, invented by A. S. Wilson, and the reciprocating, or scillating shuttle, invented by I. M. inger. In recent years the use of the ectric motor to run sewing machines as become extensive.




