MARSHALIS

On recommendation of the Minister of Marine and Fisheries and under the provisions of Section 10 of A special cut price on Wall Chapter II of the Consolidated Statutes (Third Series) and in order to save the Lobster Fishery from extinction, His Excellency the Governor-in-Council has been pleased to approve of the following amendment of the Regulations made on the first day of November, 1921, respecting the Lobster and other Fisheries

No person shall. kill, take, Catch, sell or can any Lobsters, nor shall any person engage in the business of canning lobsters, at any place, or on any portion of the coast in the Colony, for a period of three years commencing on the First day of January, 1925, and ending on the Thirty-first day of December, 1927.
