REWARD OFFERED TO APPREHEND MURDERER

Selectmen of Massachusetts Town Want to Capture. Boy's Destroyer

GREAT BARRINGTON, Mass., July 19.—The selectmen of the town today offered a reward of \$250 for information leading to the arrest of the murderer of John Streub, the 12 year old boy whose body was found last Sunday in the woods near Housatonic. This action was contemplated several days ago, but was postponed at that time, as the celectmen had reason to think that an arrest would be made very shortly without the incentive of a reward. The developments of the official investigation of the last few days, however, have been of little value, so the decision to announce the reward was reached today.

It is believed that the murder was committed on the morning of Tuesday, July 10. According to relatives of young Streub, he was absent from his tion leading to the arrest of the mur young Streub, he was absent from his home on the Monday night preceding, and the efforts of the detectives today have been directed in part to finding out where the boy spent that night. This part of the investigation is con-ducted on the theory that the boy was willed by tramps, but the officers do not deny that they are conducting other lines of inquiry pointing in quite another direction.

It was said tonight that there is little likelihood that any arrest will be made until after the inquest is held, and the date of the inquest has not yet been set.
