Crandal, W. Sears, D. Crandal, and J. Newcomb be a Committee to make arrangements for Educational meetings, and to co-operate with Brother Chase in carrying the design of his agency into effect.

The Committee on the Union Society submitted their Report, which was adopted. [Appendix G.]

The Committee appointed to prepare a resolution relative to the death of Elders A. McDonald, and Edwd. Manning, submitted the following Obituary, which was ordered to be printed in the Minutes.

Resolved, That we cannot allow this Session to close, without taking special note of the Providence of God, which has removed from among us Rev.
