SHIPMENT OF ST. JOHN.

Vessels Wrecked, Abandoned, Broken Up, Condemned, Sold and Transferred to Other Ports, During the Year 1899.
Schooner Sabrina, 111 tons, built at St. John, N. B., in 1883, by Calvis S. Phillips; D. A. McDonald master; sailed from Cheshire, N. S., for Weymouth, Mass., with a cargo of plaster, and on the 2nd January, 1899, went up on shore at the mouth of Dartmouth Bay, Me., and became a total loss.
McDonald, of Halifax, N. S.
Ship Anglo-America, 1833 tons, built at St. John, N. B., in 1876, by Hilary Bros., was sold to foreigners (Italians) in February, 1899, for £1000, paid by William Ross, of Liverpool, Eng.
Barque Galatea, 112 tons, H. D. Lewis master, built at Harvey, Albert County, N. B., in 1881, by G. S. Turner; sailed from this port, and on the 1st February, 1899, for Boston, with a cargo of salt, was dismasted and waterlogged, and was abandoned on the 13th February, 1899, in the Gulf Stream; seven of the crew were taken off by S. S. Garton. The master and six of the crew left in one of the ships boats, and have not been heard of since. Vessel owned by Ernest J. Oliver of this port.
Schooner Roy, 90 tons, D. Gilchrist master, built at Canning, Nova Scotia, N. B., in 1883, by John B. Hawke, sailed from this port, and on the 1st February, 1899, for Boston, with a cargo of salt, was dismasted and waterlogged, and was abandoned on the 13th February, 1899, in the Gulf Stream; seven of the crew were taken off by S. S. Garton. The master and six of the crew left in one of the ships boats, and have not been heard of since. Vessel owned by Ernest J. Oliver of this port.
Schooner Canary, 98 tons, W. E. Ray master, built at Martock, N. B., in 1881, by Schoneer, George Lynde, or, built at Martock, N. B., in 1880, by Lt. Col. W. Lynde, D. R. Christopher, master; sailed from Martock, N. B., on 7th Nov., 1899, for Parrsboro, N. S., in ballast, last, and went ashore at Parrsboro, N. S., on the 13th November, 1899, at 10pm, at low water, and was afterwards towed to Parrsboro, N. S., where she became a total loss. Vessel owned by Christopher, of Hopewell, N. B.
Schooner E. Norris, 98 tons, W. E. Ray master, built at Martock, N. B., in 1881, by Schoneer, George Lynde, or, built at Martock, N. B., in 1880, by Lt. Col. W. Lynde, D. R. Christopher, master; sailed from Martock, N. B., on 7th Nov., 1899, for Parrsboro, N. S., in ballast, last, and went ashore at Parrsboro, N. S., on the 13th November, 1899, at 10pm, at low water, and was afterwards towed to Parrsboro, N. S., where she became a total loss. Vessel owned by Christopher, of Hopewell, N. B.
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
