Special to the Tribune. The Wreck of the City of Washington -Across the Ocean without Seeing Sun or Stars-Cool Conduct of Officers and Passengers-A Miraculous Escape.

HALIFAX, N. S., July 8. The tug-boat Daisy, of Liverpool, N.S., arrived here this morning with Mr. Henry Main the purser of the Inmar steamship City of Washington, from whom the following particulars of the shipwreck are gleaned. The Washing- LIKELY, ton sailed from Liverpool the 24th of June, and from leaving that port until the vessel struck on the west side of Port Harbert, on the west coast, neither sun nor star had been seen, so that it was mpossible to obtain observations during the entire passage in order to ascertain the position of the ship. When the steamer struck at 2 p. m., Saturday, the Photograph Rooms fog was so thick that no object could be seen three yards ahead; everybody on board supposed the vessel was proceed ing on her way to New York, and the only intimation to the contrary was a heavy grating sound as the vessel was driven over the rough bottom of the shoal where she now lies. The steamer was going at the rate of about nine knots an hour when she struck. There was no excitement at the time, everybody was perfectly calm and Capt. Phillips, officers, and crew, set about lowering the boats and getting the passengers on shore of whom there were 28 cabin, and 481 steerage. Meantime the guns were fired from the stranded ship and in answer to them the men came alongside in a small boat from whom the first information was obtained as to the place where the vessel had been driven to. Fortunately the sea was calm and the distance from the main land was only about a quarter of a mile. All the boats were speedily launched and manned, and in 3 hours from the time of the disaster every living soul on board was safely landed at Port Le Bar where the inhabitants busied themselves in assisting to provide temporary accommodation for the passengers and crew. All the passengers' luggage effects, ship stores, were also saved and landed, the ship laying on an even keel as if riding at anchor. There is about fifteen feet of water at high tide on the shoal. 
