The Mission is prosperous and promising; and, what I highly admire, they are not ashamed of Methodism. Some have joined, and are brought to God—others are seeking. We are beginning our *winter's work* on Tuesday first, by holding our first meeting for a "special effort," careless what class of Satan's subjects are displeased if God be glorified. I feel satisfied, if the good friends through the Province had the same opportunity of seeing the good effects of supporting a Mission here as I have, they would feel amply paid; and for their encouragement, it is on the very eve of supporting the townships of Warwick, Adelaide, Bosanquet, Plympton, and Enniskillen. I have been out upon an expedition as far as the waters of Huron; and, by the way, at the lake, I saw much of the beauties of nature;—but nothing, either by land or sea, ever gave me such sublime ideas of the great I Am, as the beautiful pebbles on the shores of Huron, where every blue breaker mirrors forth the incomprehensible, invisible, omnipotent Creator!

GOSFIELD.

The Mission department of the Gosfield Circuit includes the Townships of Maidstone, Rochester, and West Tilbury, in the Western District of the Province. The prospect among the inhabitants of these Townships is very encouraging. Two settlements of Ojebway Indians have been attended to, as well as the Indians on the Island of Point-au-Pélee, in Lake Erie, during the year. The Missionaries, the Revs. Solomon Waldron and Thomas Williams, have furnished the following interesting report of their labours on the Mission:

With regard to the Missionary labour on this Circuit I would state, that the Gosfield Circuit embraces at present the following Townships, viz: East Tilbury, Romney, Mersea, Gosfield, Colchester, Malden, Maidstone, Rochester, and West Tilbury. The first six of these compose the old Gosfield Circuit; the latter three have been added, and during the year we have bestowed as much labour upon them as we could well share from the older settlements. The old Circuit being quite extensive and entirely detached from the new Townships, and owing to the swampy nature of the land, the newness of the roads, and the openness of last winter, our visits latterly were few and rather "far between,"—the swamps not being frozen over so as to admit of travelling on horse but a few weeks during the whole winter. But when we were able to visit them, our visits were encour-
