# 300 FREIGHT CARS TO CARRY BERRIES

Will Be Required To Move British Columbia 1921

WINNIPEG, March 11.—It will take about 300 freight cars to move the 1921 British Columbia berry crop, if present estimates of the British Columbia Berry Growers' Association turns out to be correct. This means a production of 2,500 tons of small fruits for the year. Owing to their bulk a freight car will only handle about six tons of small fruits.
