

Death of D. S. Gondall.

Word has been received in Woodstock of the death in New York of Daniel S. Gondall, chief editorial writer for The New York Commercial for the past ten years. Erysipelas, which set in after an operation was the cause of death. He was a native of Woodstock, and for many years was a well-known resident. He was born here about fifty years ago, and received his education in the local schools. He studied law and practiced in Woodstock for several years. It was chiefly through his instrumentality that The Express newspaper, the publication of which was begun in 1898, was organized. At that time he abandoned law and engaged actively in journalism. Subsequently he went to the Western States and was connected with different newspapers. Latterly, however, he had been in New York. He is survived by one brother and one sister, Augustus Gondall, President of the First National Bank of Rock Spring, Wyoming, and Miss Rebecca Gondall, of Beverleigh Minehead, Somerset, England. Interment will be made in Woodstock.
