Territorial Court
 There was no session of court this morning in Mr. Justice Dugas' department. Mr. Justice Craig delivered a couple of judgments and later heard counsel in the case of the King vs. Clarke, being the Monroe libel case. His lordship was informed by the clerk of Mr. Justice Dugas' desire to leave the city tomorrow and his wish that he could be relieved of hearing the case. It was finally decided to have the pleadings settled tomorrow morning at 10 o'clock when the case will be set for trial early next week. The balance of the forenoon was taken up by the hearing of the case of the News Publishing Company vs. Nicodet. This afternoon the court of appeal is in session and will render several important judgments.

SEVERE CASE OF SMALLPOX
 Is That Taken From Str. Whitehorse
 Residents of Dog Island Being Well Cared for by Government.

The government is rushing up tents and bedding and the passengers will tomorrow be settled on the island. The Whitehorse will land all its food supplies for them, and then the boat will be stripped of all the bedding and hangings that have been in use, which will be destroyed. The vessel will then be thoroughly fumigated for a couple of days and probably permitted to return to her run. All her officers and crew, however, will remain quarantined, an entirely new crew coming from Whitehorse on the Dawson tomorrow to take their places.

What White Pass Manager Rogers most particularly regrets is that I. W. Dudley is among the detained. In addition to his duties as auditor of the company, Mr. Dudley has been appointed special agent, and he has important instructions for Mr. Rogers in regard to the operations of the season.

FABULOUSLY RICH QUARTZ
 King Solomon's Mines Take Second Place.
 Ore is One-Third Pure Virgin Gold and Assays \$236,000 to the Ton.

even more so. It informs the credulous public that the quartz is one-third gold and out of 1000 pounds of ore 1233 1-3 pounds of pure, virgin gold may be obtained. The assay value of the rock is given at the modest figure of \$236,000 a ton, as shown by the certificate of John Nicholson, mineralogist. The extent of the vein, the location of the ledge which would make King Solomon's famous producer pale into insignificance is a mystery, nor is it stated how much ore of the character of that shown is in sight and how much on the dump. With such fabulously rich ore one would need only a few pack train loads of the stuff and a bronchiate of sufficient size would be had to buy up San Francisco with Seattle and Vancouver thrown in.
