VIII. And whereas the said Trustees, in order to give to the roads under Recital. their management and control, the width required by law, may have passed through lands, kitchen-gardens and orchards without first obtaining the consent of the proprietors thereof, be it enacted, that should it be Damage not 5 satisfactorily proved by the said Trustees that the portion of land so taken to be paid possession of contained neither cultivated vegetables nor fruit trees, and none has been that the said parties suffered no other damage than that of being deprived really sustainof the quantity of land allowed by law for the said roads; any Court ed. of law before whom any such action or legal proceedings may be 10 brought, or before whom such action or legal proceeding may now be pending, shall upon proof to their satisfaction that the said parties shall have suffered no other damage than as aforesaid, dismiss the said action or other legal proceeding, with costs against the Plaintiff or Complainant.
