

# Raiders Enjoy Weekend Sweep of MUN

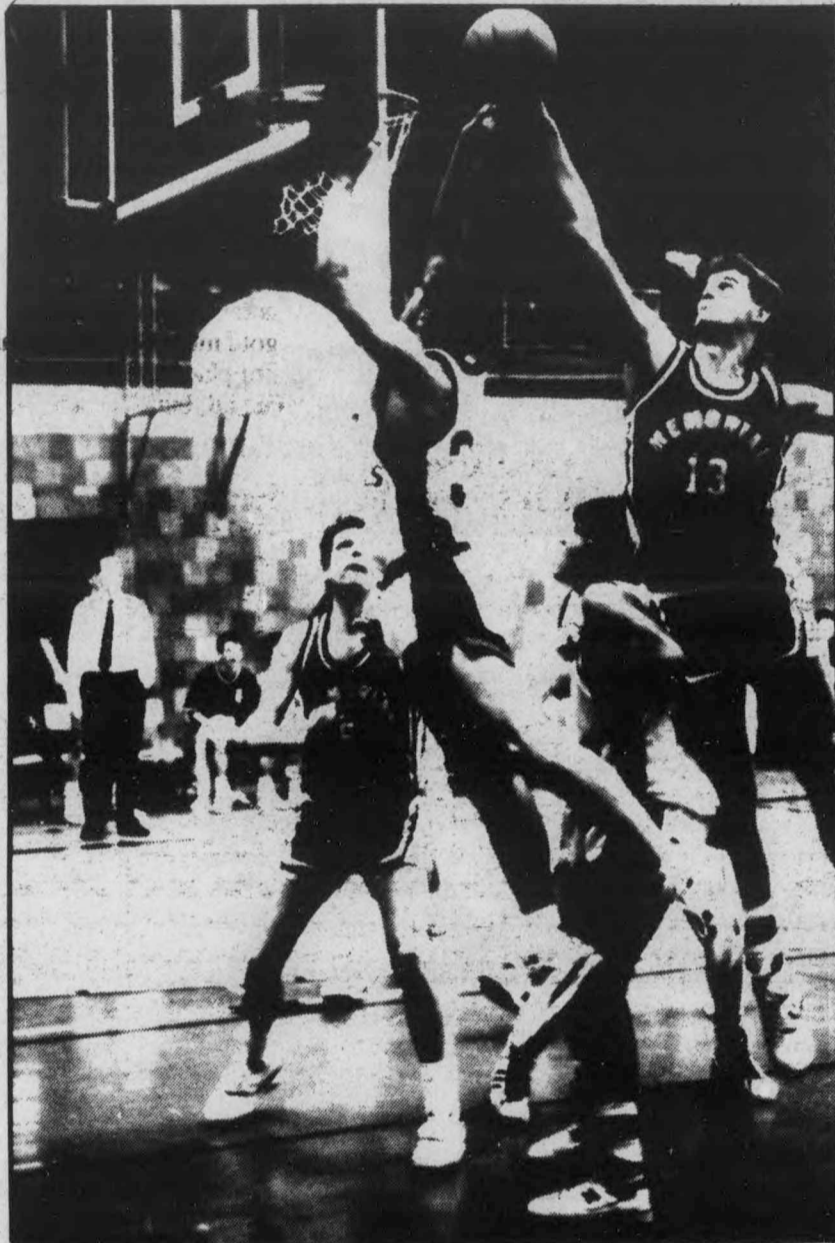

Victory belonged to the UNB Red Raiders over the past weekend. UNB handed Memorial University two losses to gain two more conference wins for the Raiders. The team played fantastic basketball over the weekend and the effort was very strong.

Saturday night the Raiders took to the court against the Memorial team from Newfoundland. The game was textbook basketball all the way. At half time UNB was ahead 40-38. The second half turned out to be the clincher for UNB. The team rallied together and defeated MUN 73-65. Glen Read had an excellent game against Memorial as he shot for 26 points. Andy MacKay added 13 points for the Raiders and Vinod Nair shot for 12 points.

Sunday was another day of victory for the young Raiders as UNB managed to contain MUN's top scorer. In Saturday's game they kept the number one scoring MUN player down to only 11 points. Sunday was no different. At half time UNB was ahead of MUN 48-43. UNB played a very tough defensive game against MUN. Final score was UNB 97, MUN 81. Yaw Obeng shot for 21 points to

## AWARDS FOR EXCELLENCE IN TEACHING

**THE AWARD** is dedicated to the late Dr. Allan P. Stuart and is to honour persons who are representative of outstanding teaching achievement at the University of New Brunswick.

**ELIGIBILITY:** A candidate must teach at least one 3 credit-hour undergraduate course during each term of the academic year at the University. It is not expected that the nominees should excel in all criteria listed on the nomination form, but they should be qualified in most categories. Individuals are not eligible if they have been previous recipients of the Award.

**NOMINATION:** Candidates for the Award are proposed and recommended to the Senate Committee on Quality of Teaching by students and faculty of the University.

The basic information required is contained on the Nomination Forms, which are available from the University Secretary, Fredericton; the Dean of Faculty, Saint John; the Student Council, Saint John or Fredericton; and Faculty offices. No one may nominate or support more than one candidate.
