Sir,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 4th instant, in which you request me to furnish information respecting the title to a certain piece of land situated at the mouth of the Moose River, about half a mile above the mouth of the Moose River, and opposite Fort Resolution, and also concerning the survey of the townships of Dawson and Fort Resolution, and the boundaries of the same. I have been requested to furnish you with such information as I can get in regard to the title to the land in question, and also to furnish you with a copy of the plan of the townships herewith annexed, and I have to request that you will be good enough to advise me as to whether your Indians hold or own the whole or this 217 acres, or if not, their position thereto, when the legal agent will be compelled to place a value on the land required for the land on which his buildings were erected. Your obedient Servt.
 the interest of Mr. Snodgrass in the buildings in question, and you know of no objection thereto and the Indians are favourable. the permission granted to Mr. Snodgrass may be continued during the time he is employed.
