
Ottawa, March 15, 1911.

Sir,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of plans and field-notes of 12 plots of land near Lytton, B.C., which you have surveyed in accordance with instructions from this Department. The said plans and field-notes appear to be in order and are being examined. You have omitted a report on your proceedings in connection with each survey. These reports should be drawn up separately. They should contain all information relating to the claims of the Indians, your reasons for deciding on the limits surveyed, improvements if any on the land, its general quality &c., and any other useful information and especially to show that the Indians or Indians justly claimed the several areas laid out for them. Kindly supply these reports which when received will be entered in your field-book.

With reference to the lands which you state is claimed by two Indians Peter Tis-il-witah and John Shi Kempt of which you send a tracing. I have to request you to be good enough to report in full all the facts in connection with the trouble you state there is with this land.
