Sir:-

With reference to resolution passed recently by the Chippewa Council of Seugeen, I beg to say that the Department approves of assistance to the value of \$15.00 being given to Christopher Kewopson in order that he may be supplied with provisions for his family. It is to be understood that his interest moneys are to be retained in the Fall toward re-payment of the advance. A note with regard to this matter should be placed in the pay-list.

Assistance to the value of \$30.00 may also be furnished in the case of Mrs. M.J. Mahodopena, Band No. 79, in order that she may purchase siding for her house. It should be clearly understood that this woman's interest money for the Fall of 1913 and the Spring of 1914 and also the Fall of 1914 is to be retained toward the repayment of the advance. A note with regard to the matter should appear in the pay-list.

In the case of Noah Salbeson, Band No. 168, the Department approves of assistance to the value of \$10.00 being furnished in order that he may be supplied with wire. His interest moneys for the Fall of 1913 are to be retained toward re-payment. It is expected that you will make a note of the matter in the pay-list.
